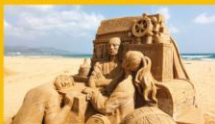

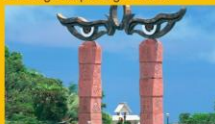

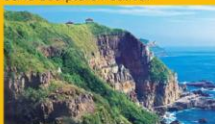

The rally venue is the municipal park for sport and outdoor leisure activities constructed in 2018. This 25-hectare park is situated on the banks of a river about 15 kms south of the city centre and boasts very modern infrastructure for a wide variety of outdoor activities.

The nearest airport is Sheremetyevo International Airport.

For those travelling by rail, the area is served by five train stations and, for rally-goers arriving by car or caravan, there are four international motorways.

Moscow and the European part of Russia have a well-developed transport system.

The rally registration fee will include the cost of a 30-day visa and Russia is introducing a simplified visa application system in 2020.

The organisers are already working on a varied programme of cultural activities and excursions.

Camping/Caravanning/Motorcaravanning

Camping tourism is growing in Finland

The popularity of camping tourism is growing steadily in Finland. The annual turnover of camping tourism is now €215 million. Net sales increased by 9% compared with last year and camping tourism generates over €79.3 million in taxes and other fiscal charges.

In co-operation with the Finnish Campsite Association, SF-Caravan, a member of F.I.C.C., conducts a follow-up survey of campsite visitors to Finland every two years. A Finnish family staying at a campsite spends an average of €237 a day during the holiday season. The cost per person per day is €104. The biggest beneficiaries of this income are local grocery stores, service stations, cafes and restaurants. The employment effect of camping tourism in Finland is approximately 2,740 person-years.

The typical camper in Finland is over 35 years old, a middle income earner, living in an adult household. The main camping season in Finland is from the beginning of June to the end of August, July being the most important month. About half of all campers use their caravan or motorcaravan throughout the year, including during the winter months. Overnight stays at campsites comprise 61% caravans/motorcaravans, 30% camping cottages/chalets and 9% tents.

82% of campers at Finnish campsites are Finnish and 18% are foreign, the largest groups of foreign campers being Germans, followed by Swedes, Russians, Norwegians and Dutch. The average price for camping accommodation at a caravan site is €15.

MISCELLANEOUS

Important to know – on campsites too

What do you do if someone has something stuck in their throat and starts choking?

If a small piece of meat or some other food item goes down the wrong way and gets stuck in someone's windpipe obstructing the airway, they run the risk of suffocation. One can often deal with this oneself by coughing violently – but if that does not work then another person needs to intervene quickly.

If you are called upon to help, you need to hit or thump the person's back. He/she needs to bend the upper body as far as possible towards the knees. Then you hit him/her up to five times with the flat of your hand (palm) between the shoulder blades. If this does not work then **you must call the emergency services immediately.**

The Heimlich manoeuvre or abdominal thrust is only an emergency solution and should definitely not be used on small children or babies.

Stand behind the affected person. Place your fist below the person's ribs in the pit of the stomach and grasp your fist with your other hand. Then perform up to five abdominal thrusts up and down to expel air from the diaphragm which should dislodge the blockage. The rib cage should not be



compressed in this manoeuvre. Whatever the outcome, the patient should be taken to hospital to check for possible cracked ribs and any other internal damage.

Practical tips – for campers too

Fridge doors: in order to make sure that your fridge closes properly, rub some talcum powder on the rubber seal from time to time. This way the seal will stay smooth and supple and the door will close firmly.

Treat marks on padded benches and corner seats in caravans and motorcaravans with bicarbonate of soda. It cleans, disinfects and neutralises odours. Apply it on the soiled surface, leave overnight and then vacuum off.

Coffee is also a good neutralising agent. Put some powdered coffee on a plate and leave in a room (or a fridge) and all musty smells will disappear.

Motorcaravans, also known as motorhomes, camper vans, caravans etc., are gaining in popularity. In the first seven months of 2019 there were 61,000 new registrations in Germany. On average this type of vehicle costs €73,500 new i.e. €2,000 more than in 2018.

The municipality of **Cunit/Spain** has closed the free campsite on the Spanish Costa Dorada. Too many campers were using the campsite and it had become very overcrowded. Sometimes there were over 100 motorcaravans parked on the campsite that should only take 30. Meanwhile Cunit town council is looking for an alternative solution so that they can continue to propose cost-free camping. The Council maintains that this type of tourism is worth pursuing because it attracts campers to the area.

Transport

Cruising is the big trend now – after camping holidays. The world market leader, Carnival (102 ships), will take approx. 30 million passengers on some 300 ships all over the world in 2019.

E-Trottinett, E-Scooter or E-Roller

In Switzerland (as in many other countries), e-scooters are “light motorcycles” with maximum electric motor power of 0.50 kW and may not be ridden at speeds exceeding 20-25km/h for which they were designed.

They may only transport one person.

Light motorcycles do not need a number plate.

In Switzerland, a rider must be at least 14 years old and have a category M licence but no licence is required to ride an e-scooter after 16 years of age.

They are not subject to type approval.

Centenary:

Citroën’s Centenary celebrations were held in La Ferté-Vidam, 120 kms west of Paris.

Curry sausage arrived on the scene 100 years ago. A great favourite in Germany and widely sold at stalls and booths.

The highest motorway bridge is in China, the land of superlatives.

The Beipanjiang Bridge in the south-west of the country is 565m high and links the Yunnan and Guizhou provinces. It is on the G56 Hangrui Expressway that runs for nearly 3,000 kms to the Myanmar border.

The Oktoberfest happened again in Munich this September as it does every year. It appears that the number of visitors in 2019 exceeded last year’s figure of 6.3 million from 65 different countries. In 2018, 7.5 million litres of beer were drunk and visitors consumed 124 oxen, 79,000 knuckles of pork and 510,000 chickens.

Environment

The New Zealand **Kakapo**, is threatened with extinction. However 2019 proved to be a record breeding season for this strange bird. A total of 77 chicks emerged from 249 eggs bringing the numbers of this flightless parrot back up to 200.

During the autumn months **hedgehogs** are out and about looking for somewhere to hibernate. Numbers of hedgehogs are plummeting because their habitat is shrinking fast. Also many of them are run over as they cross roads. Drivers should brake to let them pass – but only if they can do so safely in the absence of other traffic.

Forests are suffering and not only in Brazil but in Europe too. It is not just the hot summers of the past two years that is to blame – we need to create more pristine ecosystems.
